Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to you to share an important message about our school community. This year, we have been very proud of our students. They have worked hard to be kind, respectful and inclusive. Many students have shown that they understand how important it is to treat everyone fairly, whatever their background, beliefs or identity. This is something we value highly as a school.

We also recognise that outside of school, there are sometimes negative messages and extreme views shared on social media and other platforms. We are especially proud that, despite this, most of our students continue to make positive choices.

However, in the last few weeks we have seen a small increase in incidents where students have made comments that could be hurtful or prejudiced. This is disappointing and not what we expect from our students.

At our school, we are clear:

we are an inclusive and welcoming community, and prejudice of any kind is not acceptable. This includes language or actions that target someone's race, religion, gender, disability or any other difference.

We ask for your support in reinforcing this message at home by:

- Talking to your child about the importance of kindness and respect
- Reminding them that words can hurt and that everyone deserves to feel safe
- Encouraging them to speak up or seek help if they see or hear something inappropriate

By working together, we can ensure that our school remains a safe and positive place for all students.
